Did You Know?



The Sicilian ceramic heads, also known as Teste di Moro, are based on a legend of tragic love and betrayal:

The lovers: A Sicilian girl of noble birth falls in love with a young Moor merchant.

The discovery: Her family discovers their affair and punishes them by beheading them.

The vases: Their heads are turned into vases and displayed on a balcony as a warning.

The basil: In another version of the story, the girl plants a basil seed in her lover's head and waters it with her tears. The basil grows well and attracts the attention of her neighbors, who also make ceramic head vases for their own herbs.

The symbol: The ceramic heads are often displayed in pairs, representing the tragic love story of the young couple.

The legend is said to have taken place in Palermo during the Moors' domination of Sicily. You can find Sicilian ceramic heads in many places in Sicily, including hotels, restaurants, homes, balconies, and streets. You can also see them in our neighborhood on J street!
